--- Living the Volunteer Spirit -- -



The Penny Pines Program began in California in 1941. The basic contribution to Penny Pines is \$68. Why this amount? Back in 1941, seedlings cost about 1 cent each and 680 seedlings were used to plant a typical acre. Site preparation and planting costs were met through regular Forest Service appropriations.

Funds contributed under the Penny Pines Program are to be used for reforestation. Weighing heavily

in past decisions not to raise the minimum donation were comments received from the California Federation of Women's Clubs and the California Garden Clubs, Inc. They felt that increasing the minimum donation would have a more adverse effect on fundraising than the fact that the \$68 minimal donation would plant somewhat less than one acre.

To date, those pennies have amounted to well over 1 million dollars and the program is a statewide conservation project.

Did You Know...?

Laura Perrott Mahan, a member of the Eureka Women's Club, knew that bringing the California Federation of Women's Clubs yearly conference to Eureka may be just what was needed to protect a marvelous threatened grove alongside the Eel River and the mouth of Bull Creek.

Laura led the charge to bring the Federation yearly meeting to the Eureka Inn in 1923 and won the bid. Part of the conference included taking participants on a trip to the Eel River, where Eureka cub women announced their plans to save the very grove they



were standing in. A dollar from each member in the state would raise enough to be matched by the state and save the grove. The campaign worked, \$45,000 was raised, the grove was saved, and Julia Morgan was chosen to design the Hearthstone monument commemorating the women's work, located within the new grove, widely known nowadays as Women's Fed.

City of Tracy's Recycling Management Analyst,
who will present on Recycling and
Sustainability. She will cover Senate Bill 1383
requirements and key points from Tracy's
Ultimate Guide to Solid Waste and Recycling.
"Simple actions can help create a healthier
planet for future generations."

In the meantime, here is some info on the **3Rs: Reduce, Reuse and Recycle**

Reduce: means purchasing durable longlasting goods and seeking products and packaging that can be used again and again.

Reuse: the act of using a product multiple times, donating, or selling your used items. Some suggestions: using coffee mugs vs. disposable cups, using refillable bottles, reusing boxes, turning empty jars into containers.

Recycle: turns materials that would become waste into valuable resources. Materials like glass, metal, plastics and paper are collected, separated, and sent to facilities that can process them into new products.
